



## THE ROYAL FEDERATION OF AERO CLUBS OF AUSTRALIA

### RFACA LEARN TO FLY SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION CONDITIONS OF ENTRY- 2019/2020

1. Information on how to enter and prizes form part of these conditions of entry.
2. The Scholarship Competition commences on 1 October 2019 and closes on 10 April 2020.
3. All entrants who fly a Trial Flight with an RFACA Member Organisation between the commencement and closing date of scholarship will be considered for nomination by that Organisation for a RFACA Learn to Fly Scholarship.
4. To qualify for the sponsorship of \$7700 including GST or \$7000 if GST free, worth of flying, entrants must:
  - (i) Be at least 15 years of age on 30 April 2020.
  - (ii) Give an undertaking that they have had no formal flying training prior to taking a Trial Flight with an RFACA Member Organisation.
  - (iii) Be able to meet Recreational or Private Pilot Licence Medical Standards.
5. Entrants will be assessed on their suitability for formal flying training as well as a written brief statement explaining why they wish to learn to fly. The Committee of each participating RFACA Organisation will select **THREE** candidates to be entered in the draw for the prize. The decision of the Committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The draw will be conducted by the The Royal Federation of Aero Clubs of Australia on 24 April 2020.
6. The Scholarship must be flown at the RFACA Flying Training Organisation that has nominated them and the \$7700 or \$7000 prize must be expended by 30 April 2021.
7. Employees of Airservices Australia, RFACA and its Member Clubs and Flying Schools, RFACA Executive, Technical Advisory & Safety Committee and their immediate families are not eligible for the Competition.
8. The winners of the Scholarship Competition will be notified in writing no later than 15 May 2021.
9. Should the Winner have commenced Flying Training at an RFACA Organisation prior to winning the scholarship, any fees paid for such training will be reimbursed up to the value of the scholarship (\$7700 or \$7000).
10. The value of the scholarship is not transferable unless agreed to in writing by the executive of the RFACA and is not redeemable. The flying fees accrued by the Winners up to the sum of \$7700 or \$7000 will be reimbursed on a monthly basis to the RFACA Organisation at which the flying is carried out.

The RFACA and its employees, its members and their employees, Airservices Australia and its employees accept no responsibility or liability for any act or incident that occurs in connection with this competition which results from or is caused by any act or omission of the organisers or any other person.
