LEARN TO FLY SCHOLARSHIP 2020 - AB-INITIO PILOT TRAINING

Conditions of entry

1. Information on how to enter and scholarships form part of these conditions of entry.
2. All entrants who fly a Trial Instructional Flight (TIF) with an RFACA member organisation between 1 October 2019 and 10 April 2020 may be considered for nomination by that organisation for the 2020 RFACA Learn to Fly Scholarship.
3. The value of the scholarship is \$7,700 including GST, or \$7,000 for training that is free of GST.
4. To qualify, students must:
 - Be at least 15 years of age on 30 April 2020, and
 - Be able to meet Recreational or Private Pilot License medical standards, and
 - Have had no formal flying training prior to taking a TIF with an RFACA member organisation.
5. The RFACA member organisation may select up to three students, assessed on suitability for formal flight training and a brief essay from the student on why they want to learn to fly, to be entered in the draw for the scholarship. The decision shall be final and no correspondence will be entered into. The selection of the recipient of the scholarship will be conducted by the RFACA on 28 April 2020.
6. The scholarship must be applied to training at the nominated RFACA member organisation and the \$7,700 scholarship must be expended by 30 April 2021.
7. Employees of RFACA, its member organisations, its Technical Advisory and Safety Committee, and Airservices Australia, and their immediate families are not eligible for the scholarship.
8. The recipient will be notified in writing no later than 15 May 2020.
9. Should the recipient have commenced training at an RFACA organisation prior to winning the scholarship, any fees already paid for such training shall be reimbursed up to the value of the scholarship.
10. The value of the scholarship is not transferrable unless agreed to in writing by the Executive of the RFACA and is not redeemable for cash. The training fees accrued by the recipient up to the value of the scholarship shall be reimbursed monthly to the RFACA member organisation at which the training is carried out.
11. The RFACA and its employees, its members and their employees, Airservices Australia and its employees accept not responsibility or liability for any act or incident that occurs in connection with the scholarship which results from or is caused by any act or omission of the organisers or any other person.
12. The Learn to Fly Scholarship is organised by the Royal Federation of Aero Clubs of Australia (ABN 27 008 044 634), 604 New England Highway, Rutherford NSW 2320. The draw will take place at RFACA offices.
